


Olaf T. Engvig 2015 Outstanding Scandinavian American



Olaf Engvig has devoted much of his life to his passion – saving and restoring historic Norwegian ships and writing about our Scandinavian maritime heritage. He has written frequently about historic Norwegian ships in both Norwegian and English and is a frequent speaker for Sons of Norway lodges and other organizations. For his work he was awarded the Gold Medal of Merit from King Harald V of Norway and the Saint Olav's Medal from King Olav V. Olaf grew up in Norway and began sailing at an early age. He has a graduate degree in maritime history from the University of Oslo and also has a US Army rocket specialist education.
